## Processional Gospel: John 12:12-19

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord—the King of Israel!" <sup>14</sup> Jesus found a young donkey and sat on it; as it is written: <sup>15</sup> "Do not be afraid, daughter of Zion. Look, your king is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt!" <sup>16</sup> His disciples did not understand these things at first; but when

Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that these things had been written of him and had been done to him. <sup>17</sup> So the crowd that had been with him when he called Lazarus out of the tomb and raised him from the dead continued to testify. <sup>[a]</sup> <sup>18</sup> It was also because they heard that he had performed this sign that the crowd went to meet him. <sup>19</sup> The Pharisees then said to one another, "You see, you can do nothing. Look, the world has gone after him!"

#### **MEDITATION ON GOD'S WORD**

LENTEN READING:

The Lenten Candles

"A Royal Reception"

(Please join in reading responsively the Lenten Reading.)

NARRATOR: Today is Palm Sunday. The crowds cheered and shouted:

**C:** Hosanna in the highest, blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! NARRATOR: They waved palm branches and spread their garments out on the road as Jesus entered Jerusalem.

C: The whole city joined in to give Jesus a hero's welcome, a ticker-tape parade, a royal reception, and a city-wide party.

NARRATOR: But the cheers were shallow and the celebration was short-lived, for in the background, the chief priests, the scribes and Pharisees, the Saduccees and Herodians were green with envy and red with anger and they set their traps with tricky words.

C: And bought their spy with thirty coins, and prepared to kill the Son of God. NARRATOR: Today is Palm Sunday, a day of paradox. The King rode to the capital on a lowly colt, he cried at his royal reception. Today the cheers briefly held back the drumbeats of doom. Today only the Christ candle burns through the service.

#### FIRST READING: Zechariah 9:9-12

<sup>9</sup> Rejoice greatly, O daughter Zion! Shout aloud, O daughter Jerusalem! Lo, your king comes to you; triumphant and victorious is he, humble and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey.

<sup>10</sup> He<sup>[a]</sup> will cut off the chariot from Ephraim and the war-horse from Jerusalem; and the battle bow shall be cut off, and he shall command peace to the nations; his dominion shall be from sea to sea, and from the River to the ends of the earth.

- <sup>11</sup> As for you also, because of the blood of my covenant with you, I will set your prisoners free from the waterless pit.
- <sup>12</sup> Return to your stronghold, O prisoners of hope; today I declare that I will restore to you double.

<sup>19</sup> Open to me the gates of righteousness, that I may enter through them and give thanks to the LORD.

- <sup>20</sup> This is the gate of the LORD; the righteous shall enter through it.
- <sup>21</sup> I thank you that you have answered me and have become my salvation.
- <sup>22</sup> The stone that the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone.
- <sup>23</sup> This is the LORD's doing; it is marvelous in our eyes.
- <sup>24</sup> This is the day that the LORD has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it. [a]
- <sup>25</sup> Save us, we beseech you, O LORD! O LORD, we beseech you, give us success!
- <sup>26</sup> Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the LORD. We bless you from the house of the LORD.
- <sup>27</sup> The LORD is God, and he has given us light. Bind the festal procession with branches, up to the horns of the altar. [c]
- <sup>28</sup> You are my God, and I will give thanks to you; you are my God, I will extol you.
- <sup>29</sup> O give thanks to the LORD, for he is good, for his steadfast love endures forever.

### SECOND READING: Philippians 2:5-11

<sup>5</sup> Let the same mind be in you that was [a] in Christ Jesus, <sup>6</sup> who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, 7 but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, 8 he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death—even death on a cross. <sup>9</sup> Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, <sup>10</sup> so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, <sup>11</sup> and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

<sup>31</sup> In the same way the chief priests, along with the scribes, were also mocking him among themselves and saying, "He saved others; he cannot save himself. 32 Let the Messiah, [S] the King of Israel, come down from the cross now, so that we may see and believe." Those who were crucified with him also taunted him.

<sup>33</sup> When it was noon, darkness came over the whole land[1] until three in the afternoon. 34 At three o'clock Jesus cried out with a loud voice, "Eloi, Eloi, lema sabachthani?" which means, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"[u] 35 When some of the bystanders heard it, they said, "Listen, he is calling for Elijah." <sup>36</sup> And someone ran, filled a sponge with sour wine, put it on a stick, and gave it to him to drink, saying, "Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to take him down." <sup>37</sup> Then Jesus gave a loud cry and breathed his last. <sup>38</sup> And the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. <sup>39</sup> Now when the centurion, who stood facing him, saw that in this way he breathed his last, he said, "Truly this man was God's Son!"
