While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her first-born son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in manger, because there was no room for them in the inn. Luke 2:6-7

At our Christmas celebration we the words from Luke's gospel printed above. The gospel writer tells us that Jesus was "her first born." am a first born and I don't really know if that really carries with it many privileges. It seemed I had to set the example for my younger brothers. My brothers even referred to me as perfect David, even though I was not all that perfect. The distinction of being the first born doesn't really carry any weight. Just look at the scriptures.

The very fact that Luke tells us that Mary brought forth he first born tells us what kind of world God in Jesus Christ was moving into. As we look at the sweep of Scripture, we find Cain who murdered his brother Abel was Eve's first born. Ishmael, driven into wilderness by his father Abraham was first born to Abraham and Hagar. Isaac, whom Abraham nearly sacrificed was first born to Sarah. Esau was firstborn to Rebekah, yet he lost his birthright. The angel of death took the firstborn sons of the Egyptians. Bathsheba's firstborn does not even get a name before his life is required of God for King David's sin of adultery and the coverup that followed. What did this little one do? Such is the sorry state of the human sinful condition. And then we have many of the firstborns who sat on the throne in Jerusalem and Samaria who did not amount to much.

Being a firstborn is nothing to brag about in my estimation. However, the firstborn of Mary, Jesus Christ our Lord did not come into this world on the first Christmas for bragging rights. Jesus came to bring God and to show us God's love to this broken human lot. His mark of distinction would be cross and a grave. He would move in to show us how far we had been separated from God and to bring us back to God by defeating sin, death, and the devil. Dorothy Sayers writes the He was "Born in poverty and died in disgrace and thought it all very worthwhile."

And as an imperfect firstborn myself I find Jesus very worthwhile that we would all be counted as His children by His grace as the first fruit of the resurrection. In baptism Christ has made us His very own. And that is why Jesus came into the world to make us his very own, Children of God.

As we look at today's world rocked by disease, presently a pandemic, -political tension, social ills, nothing has not changed. God presence is still alive. His purpose is still being worked out because of the first-born Son of Mary whom God sent for our salvation. As enter the new year let us be assured of this truth.
